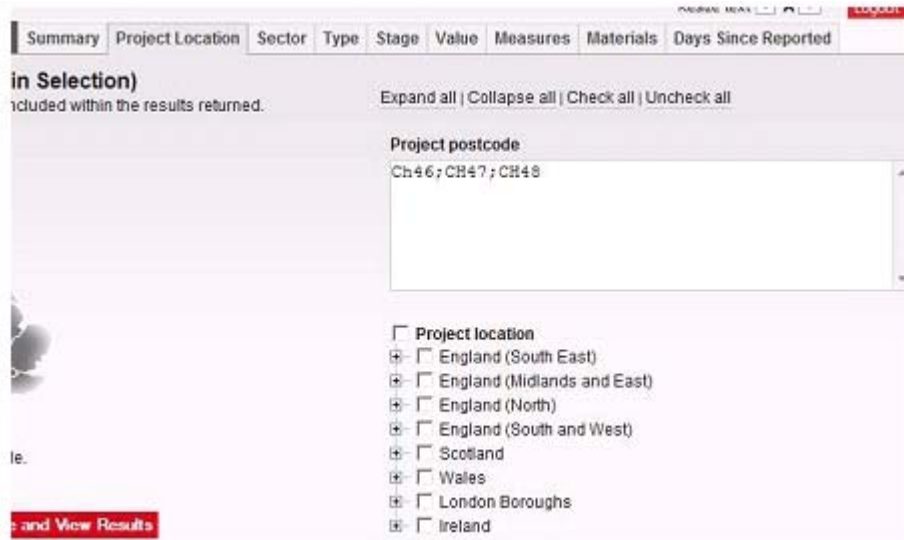


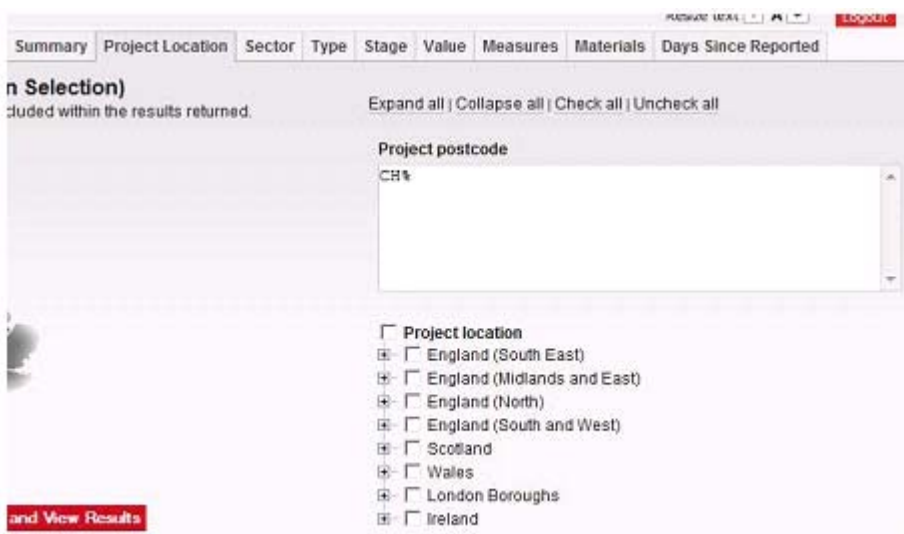
Evolution Postcode Search

Evolution allows you to search by location by postcode. This is obviously extremely useful if you are looking just for particular postcode ranges. There are, however, a few ways to shorten this process.

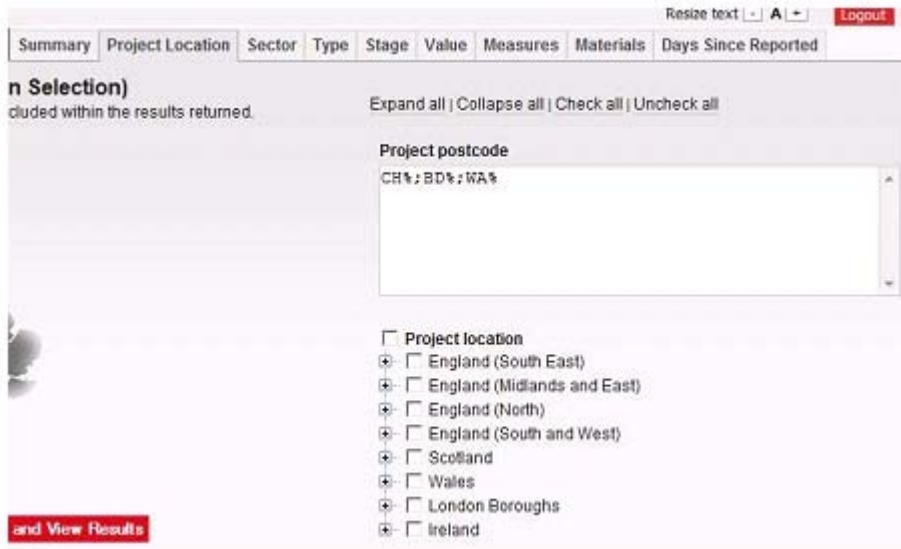
For example, if you were looking for just three postcodes you could enter each separately - they are separated by putting a semi-colon between the postcodes. For postcodes CH46, CH47 and CH48 you would enter the information into the postcode search box in Evolution as follows: (the last entry doesn't need a semicolon at the end.)



However, by using a wildcard (% sign) we can make the search a lot more comprehensive. For example, to search for all CH postcodes we would enter:



Multiple "wildcard" searches are separated by semicolons as before. For example, to search for all CH, BD and WA postcodes we would enter:



The only difficulty comes when postcodes have only one letter. If we entered "S%" as a postcode search it would also pick up SE & SW postcodes. The solution to this is to use a number in the search – for example, s1%;s2% etc.
