Welcome to our Top 50 League Tables report

Designed to provide company intelligence for those working within construction and beyond, we report on the top 50 clients, architects and contractors for the month, as well as the last 12 months.

Methodology

The tables are compiled using a mix of survey data from some of the UK's largest contractors, as well as data from Barbour ABI's database of contracts, awarded in that month or 12 month period. All tables include contracts worth £100k or more and tendered and negotiated contracts, but exclude frameworks and masterplans. The clients and architects tables are based on contract data, and ranked by projects worked upon on which a contractor has been appointed in that month or 12 month period. Contracts are only included once financial closure has been confirmed.

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Top contractors for the month

- Wilmott Dixon top the contractors league table with their seven awards totalling £181 million and pushing them up 10 places in the table. Major re-development works at Wimbledon for the All England Tennis Club contributed £80 million of the total.
- Engie took second place with three projects, the largest being a new academic building for the University of Leicester at a cost of £120 million.
- A new entrant to the table this month came in the shape of Mclaughlin & Harvey who totalled £125 million from two awards, the York potash facility providing almost all of the total.
- The most active contractors this month were Kier and Morgan Sindall who both had eight awards each.

Top architects for the month

- Associated Architects top the table as a new entrant this month. They oversaw two awards totalling £128 million. The new academic facility at Leicester University providing £120 million of their total.
- Another new entrant this month, Cartwright Pickard Architects, sit in second place after a sole award of the £120 million York Potash Facility in Redcar. Work isn't due to start until 2020 and will be on site for three years.
- Finishing off the top three for the month are another new entrant in Fletcher Priest Architects. They were involved in two awards totalling just under £81 million. A new office and retail scheme for London & Continental Railways in Axis Square, Birmingham provided £63 million of the total.
- The most active architects were Stride Treglown and AHR Building Consultancy who were both involved in six awards each.
- Harris Partnership and Capita also had good returns this month.

Top clients for the month

- The University of Leicester sit at the top of the table for top clients this month as their heavy capital investment, saw two further schemes awarded totalling £180 million. As well as the previously mentioned £120 million academic building, they are pressing ahead with a new £60 million investment in student accommodation to provide an additional 1,164 student beds.
- Sirius Minerals occupy the runners up spot thanks to the York potash Facility in Redcar at a cost of £120 million.
- Another new entrant this month sees Premier Oil take third place in the table. Their £100 million scheme to provide a new onshore pipeline is expected to be complete for December 2020. Centrica will be carrying out the contract.
- Network Rail had a busy month with 20 awards granted, totalling just under £66 million.
- The Department of Education and Aldi Stores both had six awards each this month, totalling £61 million and £33 million, respectively.

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
